

FWCP-Peace Community Donation Fund

Each year the Fish and Wildlife Compensation Program – Peace allocates funds to interested community groups. This year, \$5,000 is available to support activities that are consistent with our objectives to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife and their habitats in the FWCP-Peace region, which includes the Williston and Dinosaur Reservoirs. Applications are typically for \$1,000 or less but can be up to \$2,500 per request.

In the past, donations from our Community Donation Fund have supported workshops, conferences and association meetings that promote the conservation, enhancement, protection or management of species and their habitats, in communities within or in proximity to the Williston and Dinosaur Reservoirs.

All Community Donation funding requests must comply with the following guidelines:

- 1. the proposed activity must be consistent with FWCP objectives and support in some manner the conservation or enhancement of fish, wildlife or their habitats in the geographic region of the Williston and Dinosaur Reservoirs;
- 2. public events that educate or promote community participation are eligible;
- 3. recipient must acknowledge the FWCP's contribution during the public activity and/or through event advertising;
- 4. recipient must provide the FWCP-Peace with the opportunity for one or more delegates to participate in the event;
- 5. results of the proposed conference or workshop / meeting / activity must be made available to interested parties and the public;
- 6. funding is not available for private functions or invitation-only events; and
- 7. the funds cannot be used to purchase equipment or for travel.
