**RE: British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority ("BC Hydro")
Standards of Conduct**

Further to BC Hydro's Application for Approval of Standards of Conduct ("Application") that was filed with the British Columbia Utilities Commission on 22 September 2004, BC Hydro is submitting the additional supporting information that is referred to on page 3 of the Application. As described there, section 4 of the Standards of Conduct contemplates a program ("Compliance Program") to implement and ensure ongoing compliance with the Standards of Conduct. The Compliance Program was still being developed when the Application was filed, and BC Hydro committed to filing it within 60 days.

The Application also referred to a new agreement between British Columbia Transmission Corporation ("BCTC") and BC Hydro pursuant to which BC Hydro would commit to comply with the Standards of Conduct and Compliance Program as filed with the Commission and as thereafter revised by Commission Order. Thus, included in this filing at Tab D is an executed Standards of Conduct Compliance Agreement ("Agreement"), pursuant to which BCTC and BC Hydro agreed to the basis on which non-public transmission-related information is communicated by BCTC to BC Hydro personnel. Schedule A to the Agreement contains BC Hydro's Standards of Conduct, as proposed in the Application (see Schedule B to the Application), and Schedule B to the Agreement contains the Compliance Program.

Also included with this filing at Tab E is a document entitled "Information on Implementing the Standards of Conduct", which describes the specific steps BC Hydro has taken, or plans to take, to implement the Standards of Conduct and Compliance Program.


Together, the Standards of Conduct and the Compliance Program are intended to allow non-public transmission-related information obtained from BCTC to be used by BC Hydro personnel who require it for BC Hydro to perform its roles and responsibilities under the Key Agreements, while preventing such personnel from acting as a conduit of

information to others, within BC Hydro or its marketing affiliates, that are involved in electricity marketing or transmission transactions.

As provided on page 3 of the Application, BC Hydro is seeking an Order from the Commission that the Standards of Conduct, including the Compliance Program, are just and reasonable practices for BC Hydro to employ in carrying out its roles and responsibilities under the Key Agreements.

This filing comes with tabs so that it may be inserted in the binder that was filed with the Application. BC Hydro distributed the Application electronically to parties that actively participated in the recent revenue requirements hearing of BC Hydro, and is also distributing electronically this filing to them.
