

Jane Peverett, President & CEO

Jane Peverett is President and CEO of the British Columbia Transmission Corporation, a Crown corporation responsible for operating, maintaining and planning the electricity transmission system in British Columbia. Ms. Peverett joined BCTC as Vice President of Corporate Services and Chief Financial Officer upon its inception in 2003, and was promoted to her recent position in April, 2005.

Ms. Peverett joined BCTC from her role as President and CEO of Union Gas Limited in Toronto. Before joining Union Gas in 1999, she held senior positions at Westcoast Energy in Vancouver (1988-1999) including Vice President of Finance and Vice President of Regulatory Affairs and Accounting.

Ms. Peverett has a Bachelor of Commerce degree from McMaster University, a Masters Business Administration from Queen's University, and a Certified Management Accountant designation. She was recently made a Fellow of the Society of Management Accountants and has been named one of the 50 Key Women in Energy on a global basis. She was also awarded the Leadership Award for Women in Energy in the Americas.

In addition to her corporate responsibilities, Ms. Peverett serves on the Board of Directors of Encana Corporation, the largest independent oil and gas company in North America, and the University of Victoria, and is member of the Senate of the Stratford Festival of Canada. She has served on the boards of the Canadian Gas Association, the Ontario Energy Association, Voluntary Challenge & Registry, the Society of Management Accountants of BC and Junior Achievement of BC.

Ms. Peverett is an active fundraiser for and promoter of the United Way. She also believes in mentoring others, and established a mentoring process at Union Gas. She has also volunteered with the Minerva Foundation, whose mission is to create opportunities for women throughout British Columbia to realize their economic and leadership potential.
