RE: British Columbia Utilities Commission (BCUC or Commission) British Columbia Hydro and Power Authority (BC Hydro) COVID-19 Customer Relief Program Application Report No. 4 – June 2020

BC Hydro writes in compliance with BCUC Order No. G-79-20, which directed BC Hydro to, among other things:

- 1. Track the accruals in the Customer Crisis Fund (**CCF**) Regulatory Account resulting from the COVID-19 relief measures separately from those accruals to the account that were directed in BCUC Order No. G-166-17;¹ and
- Report monthly to the BCUC, commencing May 1, 2020 and for a period of six months thereafter, on the activities captured by the CCF Regulatory Account as a result of the COVID-19 relief measures and the CCF program. The activities to be reported for the COVID-19 relief measures include:²
 - (a) Bill credits provided to customers under the COVID-19 relief fund for residential customers;
 - (b) BC Hydro costs for administering the COVID-19 relief measures for residential customers;
 - (c) Interest costs recorded to the Customer Crisis Fund Regulatory Account related to the above; and

(d) Amounts paid to BC Hydro pursuant to Rate Schedule 1903.³

In this report, BC Hydro is providing the information in compliance with these directives as at June 30, 2020. As BC Hydro will not have completed its internal reporting for July 2020 until mid-August 2020, the costs and revenues related to the CCF Pilot Program and the COVID-19 relief measures for July 2020 will be provided in the September 1, 2020 report, those related to August 2020 will be provided in the October 1, 2020 report, and so on. Interest is applied to the CCF Regulatory Account starting in April 2020 and is included in monthly reports thereafter.⁴

<u>Table 1</u> below provides the information on the COVID-19 relief measures, including the bill credits for residential customers (line a), BC Hydro's incremental costs to administer the COVID-19 relief measures (line b), and interest costs (line c), for the current month, the fiscal year to date total and the life to date amounts.⁵

<u>Table 2</u> below provides information on BC Hydro's incremental costs to administer (i.e., set-up and operating costs) the CCF Pilot Program (i.e., excluding costs related to the COVID-19 relief measures; lines e, f and g) as well as revenues paid to BC Hydro from the Rate Schedule 1903 CCF Rate Rider (line d) for the current month, the fiscal year to date total and the life to date amounts.

As at June 30, 2020, BC Hydro has recognized \$32.56 million in bill credits for residential customers based on estimated consumption for program participants over the period of April 2020 to June 2020. Actual credits to June 30, 2020 were \$35.7 million. The difference between the recognized amount of bill credits and the actual amount will be recorded in July 2020. BC Hydro is not accepting new applications for the program after June 30, 2020. Some applications previously received are still being processed.
