

With the agreement of the Affected Customers, BCTC is proceeding with the following actions to implement Order No. G-103-09 and Letter L-95-09:

- The Affected Customers' queue positions were restored based on the initial queue time of their original (initial) service request. The table below illustrates the LTF PTP transmission service queue for this path.

- BCPS has been given a one time opportunity to revise the Stop Date of its OASIS Ref Nos. 72622330 and 72622381. This opportunity was provided to recognize that the previous service agreements related to these requests had included roll-over rights, while the other affected service agreements did not.

As an exception to BCTC's Business Practices, the Affected Customers' TSRs do not drop out of the queue until the Stop Date. This is to recognize that the previous service agreements related to these requests would have remained in effect until termination on the Stop Date. (Otherwise, in the ordinary course, BCTC Business Practice Section 15.3 states that if there is less than 12 months remaining in the term of a service request, BCTC will decline the TSR and it is removed from the queue.)

If firm ATC becomes available to meet the TSR of the Affected Customers' requests noted above before their Stop Date then the ATC will be offered from the period available to the TSR Stop Date. This exception is provided to recognize that the affected parties' previous contracts carried rights for service until the Stop Dates.

The Stop Dates and the applicability of BCTC Business Practice Section 15.3 for all other TSRs in the queue remain unchanged.

- The Affected Customers were provided a one time opportunity to purchase up to 11 months of monthly Short-Term Non-Firm transmission service up to the capacity specified in their pre-existing agreements in queue priority consistent with their pre-existing rights. The Affected Customers declined to exercise their option to purchase Short-Term Non-Firm transmission service.
- 305 MW will be available as Short-Term Non-Firm service to the market effective 19:00 PPT on October 29, 2009.
